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Message from the Chairman

As our summer term has just ended, now seems a good moment to reflect on what we have achieved over the last academic year. At the start of the Autumn term, the Covid-19 pandemic was still very much with us. Nonetheless, we managed to lay on a full programme of courses and activities, with over half being face-to-face and the remainder online (Zoom or hybrid). Members were able to make their own choices, based on their attitude to Covid risk, as to whether to attend classes or sit it out, attend in person or remotely. We owe a debt of gratitude to tutors for not only offering courses or organising activities, but also being prepared to adapt their materials and delivery to accommodate members' preferences. Our more physical activities taking place in external premises also needed to adapt to their specific requirements of the premises in which their events were held. We have also been able to revive our Summer School and social events, such as 'Thank You' parties for tutors. Dealing with the continual stream of new challenges that circumstances presented, our Office staff really have 'held up the sky' for us all through the last year. Which brings me to the coming year.

You will have received the Programme with this Newsletter. As every year, it contains a truly astonishing range of subjects and activities. We are very fortunate to have access to such a talented group of members who offer their time and expertise in running or organising our activities.

While the bulk of the administrative work of the organisation is done by our staff, there are various tasks for which we need the help of volunteers; some one-off or sporadic jobs are e.g. stuffing the envelopes in which you received this Newsletter and Programme. Please see details of how you can help on page 3 of this Newsletter. Essentially, we are a member-based organisation, run by its members for the benefit of the members, not a service provider from which services are purchased. If you would like to be involved in helping the organisation to continue to run smoothly, please consider volunteering.

Another way in which you can contribute is by helping to recruit new members. As you know our membership is still about 15% below its financial breakeven point, so we are nibbling into our financial reserves. The members' survey in 2019 showed that over two thirds of new members joined through being referred by a friend, so you are all our best recruiting agents. Historically, I am aware that there has been a reluctance to grow the organisation for fear that members would not be able to get onto their chosen courses. However, new members bring new tutors, as about one in eight members offers to run a course or activity, so new members will mean new courses and activities.

As an inducement to encourage your contacts to join, we are repeating the offer we made last year: for every new member you introduce who joins (and quotes your name on their application), you will be entered into a prize draw, where the prize is a year's free membership. Beyond that, if you persuade five new members to join, you will automatically get a free membership.

In the meantime, I hope you will find something of interest in our Summer School programme and be able to participate in our 40th anniversary events. Finally, on behalf of the staff and Council I wish you all an enjoyable summer.

Mode of delivery of Wednesday and Norah Boyce lectures

We recently sought your views on the use of Zoom as opposed to face-to-face ('F2F') delivery of our Wednesday and Norah Boyce lectures. We did the same last year and members' views have not materially changed – there is a 3:1 preference for Zoom, but some clearly prefer F2F. The survey did not ask your views about the possibility of hybrid delivery (e.g., a speaker physically present in Cambridge, attended by a small F2F audience of up to 30 and a Zoom audience of unspecified size). Hybrid delivery has become increasingly popular in educational contexts over recent years as social distancing has impeded F2F meeting. We therefore diligently reassessed whether we might be able to make it work for U3AC, and (while not yet finally confirmed) we think we can for the Wednesday lectures. The idea would be that the scheduled speaker is given the option of a pure Zoom lecture (obviously, speakers based abroad etc. would always choose this!), or physical attendance at our premises in Bridge Street. (It has proved extremely hard and not cost-effective to find and secure larger central Cambridge venues for the Wednesday lectures, so the best we can do is use the Pink Room, which is our largest and seats 30.) For speakers electing to stay with Zoom, there would be no change to current arrangements. If instead the speaker opts for F2F delivery, we would offer up to 30 F2F seats to members, reserved under a first-come-first-served basis. Most of those preferring a F2F event should therefore be able to obtain a seat. We will report more fully and confirm arrangements in the August Newsletter.

The situation for the Norah Boyce Lectures is slightly different as a possible venue for F2F lectures is available on Tuesday evenings, whilst staffing the U3AC premises is more difficult in the evening. Therefore, we propose to continue with a similar arrangement to last year, offering speakers a choice between Zoom and F2F, which we expect to be in Downing Place URC. We expect most Norah Boyce Lectures to be presented by Zoom, with only occasional F2F lectures.

Further to the Chairman's message, there are many opportunities for ensuring the ongoing success of the organisation by volunteering. We are currently in need of receptionists, Zoom hosts and members willing to arrange trips and visits.

Reception desk

You will be meeting and greeting members as they come into the first floor and be there to assist with any enquiries they have, plus doing photocopying for tutors. Interested members will be friendly and welcoming, and need to know their way around the website to confidently be able to answer members' queries. There is a small team of volunteer receptionists who each work one day a week and we are in need of cover for them in case of holiday or illness.

Zoom hosts

The role entails being in the U3AC premises, opening and closing Zoom classes as a host on our licenses, being alert to anyone having technical difficulties, troubleshooting and giving advice where possible, taking the register, liaising with the Office staff via walkie-talkie and tidying classrooms at the end of the day. Interested members will be friendly and welcoming, have a good understanding of computers and have attended Zoom courses. Could you spare half a day each week in term time? The day would be the same each week and would be fixed by mutual agreement. This is a very important role which benefits a large number of members, without volunteers we will be unable to host Zoom courses.

About courses

Hybrid courses information

Several courses are running in a hybrid format, whereby some members are in a classroom and others attend simultaneously via Zoom. Courses in hybrid format have the same course code, but the Zoom class has a (z) suffix eg HIS 01 and HIS 01(z) - you need to apply for one or the other. If you enrol for the classroom option you can also attend via Zoom if you cannot attend in person one week, but if you enrol for the Zoom course, you **cannot** attend in person.

Tutors' details

For data protection reasons, the Programme does not include tutors' contact details or the venue if a course is held in a member's home. This information is given on the members' area of the website. Members without internet access can obtain this information from the Office.

To view the details on the website, log in using your username and password. Your username is usually your first name, then a full stop, then your surname. The first time you log in, you will need to set up a password. To set up a password, click the 'Forgotten Password?' button on the login screen.

Please contact the Office if you have any difficulties using the website.

Access to venues

If you have mobility issues please look at the 'Course venues' pages at the end of the Programme to check whether the course you are interested in is held in an accessible room before applying for it. Though every effort is made to ensure courses are accessible.

Closing date for applications and course allocation

We would like to receive your application for courses by 1 August. Applications received after this date will not be included in the automated allocation process.

A letter giving details of which courses you have been allocated will be sent out with your membership card and Newsletter at the beginning of September.

The annual membership subscription of £97 contributes to the administration and accommodation costs of the U3AC. It is not a payment for courses, lectures or activities. Members can attend the Wednesday and Norah Boyce lectures (space permitting), apply for up to 6 courses and apply for visits arranged throughout the year.

If you apply for only ONE course and that course has a limited number of places we cannot guarantee you a place on that course, so it is advisable to provide an alternative.
